

1. Academic calendar of various MBBS batches:

MBBS batch 2021(Phase 3 -Part II)

- As per the NMC circular No U 11026/01/2022-UGMEB 31.03.2022, Electives to start from February 2025.
- Elective postings:
Block 1- 1 Feb 2025 to 18 Feb 2025 (**13 days**) – (8 hrs x13 days = 104 hrs)
Block 2 – 19 Feb 2025 to 06 March 2025 (**13 days**) – (8 hrs x13 days = 104 hrs)
- Theory/Clinical posting/ SGT classes – **07 March 2025 to 28 Feb 2026**
- Theory (1hr) /Clinical postings (3hrs) / Practical (2hrs) including SGT/Demonstration/ SDL
- Vacations – 01 week at the discretion of Dean of the institute
- Eligibility may be sent to Dean office by **2nd week of March 2026**
- Annual examination as per NMC Schedule – **March/April 2026**
- Internship to commence from **1.5.2026**

MBBS batch 2022 (Phase 3 -Part I)

- As per NMC circular No U 11026/02/2022-UGMEB 7.12.2022, MBBS Phase 3 (Part -I) classes to commence as per NMC schedule from **16 Jan 2025**
- MBBS Phase 3 (Part 1) Theory/Clinical posing/ SGT classes – **16 Jan 2025 to October 2025** (including sent up exam)
- Theory (1hr) /Clinical postings (3hrs) / Practical (2hrs) including SGT/Demonstration/ SDL
- Vacations – **02 week** at the discretion of Director/Dean/Principal of the institute
- Eligibility may be sent to Dean office by **2nd week November 2025**
- Annual examination as per NMC Schedule: **November 2025**
- MBBS Phase 3 (Part 2) class from **1 December 2025**

MBBS batch 2023 (Phase II)

- As per CBME regulation 2023 issued by NMC on 1 August 2023, MBBS Phase II classes as per NMC schedule from **1.9.2024**
- Theory/Clinical posing/ SGT classes – **1.9.2024 to 15.07.2025** (including sent up exams)
- Theory (1hr) /Clinical postings (3hrs) / Practical (2hrs) – SGT/Demonstration/ SDL/tutorial
- Vacations – 02 weeks at the discretion of Dean of the institute 30.10.2024 to 03.11.2024 (Winter) & Summer Break: (10.03.2025 to 15.03.2025).
- Internal assessment in Pathology, Microbiology, Pharmacology – 500 marks (theory/ practical each)
- Eligibility may be sent to Director/Dean/Principal office by **3rd week of July 2025**
- Annual examination as per NMC Schedule – **August 2025**
- MBBS Phase-III (Part-I) classes to commence from **1.09.2025**

MBBS batch 2024 (Phase I)

- Competency Based Medical Education (CBME) Curriculum 2024: As per NMC circular No. D-11011/500/2024-Academic Cell (e 8284443), dated 12-09-2024, implemented from MBBS batch 2024-25 onwards.
- MBBS Phase I classes as per NMC schedule from **14.10.2024-14.08.2025**
- Vacations – 02 weeks at the discretion of Director/Dean/Principal of the institute.
- Eligibility may be sent to Director/Dean/Principal office by **3rd week of August 2025**
- Annual examination as per NMC Schedule – **August/September 2025**
- MBBS Phase-II classes to commence from **1.10.2025**

2. Guidelines for Competency Based Medical Education (CBME) Curriculum 2024:

As per NMC circular No. D-11011/500/2024-Academic Cell (e 8284443), dated 12-09-2024, implemented from MBBS batch 2024-25 onwards. The salient highlights are as follows:

- Every college shall arrange for a meeting with parents/ wards of all students and records of the same shall be made available to UGMEB of NMC.
- Mentor- mentee program shall be carried out judiciously, with the ratio of 1 Mentor to 3 mentees. Mentor may be selected from all disciplines from the level of Professor/ HOD to Assistant Professor. Mentor shall be allotted his mentees during the foundation course itself from Phase 1. The mentee shall stay connected with the Mentor throughout his career till he completes CRMI. Each year when 3 new mentees are added from phase 1 to the mentor, the senior batch students shall support the junior students and create a healthy sibling environment.
- Teaching learning and assessment may be carried out using bilingual mode (Assamese, Bangla, Gujarati, Hindi, Kannada, Malayalam, Marathi, Odiya, Punjabi, Tamil, and Telugu) along with English language.
- Foundation course will be of 2 weeks (80 hours) duration at the start of the course. It was suggested that for few of the sessions in foundation course, eminent/ visiting faculty can be invited for the same.
- CBME competencies in Vol I, II, III have been revised
- The internal assessment marks for each subject will be out of 100 for theory and out of 100 for practical/clinical (except in General Medicine, General Surgery and Obstetrics & Gynaecology, in which theory and practical assessment will be of 200 marks each). Phase wise internal assessment is mentioned for all subject except for OBG and Paediatrics. Hence, the following may be followed:
 - **OBG:** The final cumulative IA is 200 marks for theory and practical each.
200 marks across phases: Phase II (50 marks), Phase III Part 1(50 marks), Phase III Part 2 (100 marks)
 - **Paediatrics:** The final cumulative IA is 100 for theory and practical each
100 marks across phases: Phase II (25 marks), Phase III Part 1 (25 marks), Phase III- Part I (50 marks).
- Pandemic module teaching hours are separately mentioned for each phase.
- AETCOM Modules teaching and assessment has been revised (AETCOM question in each paper)
- Curriculum for Family Adoption Program (FAP) & log book perform given
- Alignment of subjects need to be done in each phase - an example for alignment of subjects to be followed in phase I and II is given.
- Alignment and integration (AIT) teaching - The six integrated modules to be used across 4 years ½ are anemia, ischemic heart disease, diabetes mellitus, tuberculosis, hypertension and thyroid disorders.
- Faculty from Department of Respiratory Medicine preferably may be included for the delivery of AIT module on tuberculosis.
- Guidelines on Remedial measures have been elaborated and may be followed.
- The log book shall also include records of outpatients assigned. Submission of the log book/ case record to the department is required for eligibility to appear for the final examination of the subject. An e-logbook is desirable.
- Phase III Part 1 examination shall be held in the subjects of Community Medicine, Forensic Medicine & Toxicology, Ophthalmology and Otorhinolaryngology.
- Appointment of Examiners: Person appointed as an examiner in the particular subject must have at least three years of total teaching experience as Assistant Professor after obtaining postgraduate

degree following MBBS, in the concerned subject in a college affiliated to a recognized medical college (by UGMEB of NMC).

- The Examiners for General Surgery and allied subjects shall be from General Surgery and 25% from orthopedics. **There shall be one orthopedics examiner out of four examiners** (either internal or external).
- Forensic medicine university practical exam – 100 marks form MBBS 2024 batches onwards.
- Theory question paper:
 - Medicine & allied Paper-2 to have Medicine 50%, Psychiatry 25% and Dermatology 25% questions.
 - Surgery & allied Paper-2 to have General Surgery 40%, Orthopaedics 40%, Anaesthesia 10% and Radiodiagnosis 10%.
