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CHAPTER-I ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

Pandit Bhagwat Dayal Sharma University of Health Sciences, Rohtak has been established by the Haryana Act No.26 of 2008. This Act has come into force w.e.f. 2.6.2008 vide Haryana Government Notification No. S.O.74/ H.A. 26/2008/S.I./2008 dated 18-8-2008. This University was established for imparting quality education in various branches of Health Sciences at higher level. All the institutes in the state of Haryana engaged in imparting education in Medical Sciences, Pharmaceutical Sciences, Dental Sciences and allied disciplines are affiliated with Pt. B. D. Sharma University of Health Sciences, Rohtak. The University shall exercise its powers throughout the State. This University is the first University of Health Sciences in the State. It is located at a distance of 70 Km North-West of Delhi on the National Highway No. 10, spread over a sprawling 350 acres of land in the historic town of Rohtak city. Rohtak is very well connected with excellent road and railway network. The College of Pharmacy, Pt. B.D. Sharma PGIMS, Rohtak is approved by AICTE and governed by the Act of Pt. B. D. Sharma University of Health Sciences, Rohtak. Twenty Six (26) Unaided/private Pharmacy Colleges are affiliated to this University. College of Pharmacy came into existence in 2007-2008 with the introduction of 4 years' B. Pharm. course. This course is highly specialized and multidisciplinary in nature and has high employment potential in India and abroad. AICTE had accorded approval for introduction of M. Pharm. course in Pharmaceutics from the academic session 2011-12 and M. Pharm. course in Pharmaceutical Biotechnology from the academic session 2012-13.

CHAPTER-II

IMPORTANT DATES/ TIMINGS

1. Availability of Forms: : 19 June, 2017
2. Last date of receipt of Application Forms : 10 July, 2017
(up to 2:00 PM) with the condition that if the result of final year of B. Pharm. of Pt. B. D. Sharma University of Health Sciences is not declared till then, Last date of receipt of Application Forms would be considered as seven days after the date of declaration of result.
3. Date of declaration of result: To be notified on University website after declaration of result of final year of B. Pharm. of Pt. B. D. Sharma University of Health Sciences, Rohtak.
4. Date & Time of Counseling: To be notified on University website.
5. Venue of Counseling: Committee Room, Director's office, Pt. B. D. Sharma, PGIMS, Rohtak. Waiting list shall be generated for any vacancies in future, subject to change if university decides so.

(No correspondence will be undertaken for intimation of counseling date and merit)

IMPORTANT NOTE: All the eligible candidates, who apply for M. Pharm. course, will be allowed provisionally to appear for counseling. Admission shall be offered subject to eligibility and verification of documents/certificates at the time of counseling.

Provisional submission of Admission form

A candidate whose result of qualifying examination has not been announced till the date notified for submission of application form can also apply provisionally. However, he/she will have to produce proof of his/her having passed the examination on the basis of which he/she claims eligibility to appear in the counseling by the date of the 1st counseling. A candidate who fails to produce the original certificates, marks-sheets and other certificates on the basis of which he/she is claiming to be eligible for admission to the course even at the time of counseling shall not be considered for admission even if he/she has been placed in the merit list.

CHAPTER-III ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Eligibility for the Course

1. He/she must attain the age of minimum **21 years on 31.12.2017**.
Note: The age shall be determined as per entry in the Matriculation/Higher Secondary or its equivalent certificate.
2. The candidate must have passed B. Pharm. from AICTE/PCI approved institution, with minimum of 55 % (50% for SC/BC) aggregate marks.
3. Candidate shall be medically fit.
4. Candidate shall be a citizen of India.
5. The provisional admission shall be made strictly in order of merit of valid GPAT score, if the seat(s) remain vacant, the vacant seat(s) shall be offered to Non-GPAT candidate(s) strictly in order of merit based on marks obtained in theory subjects of B. Pharmacy Course obtained from only AICTE/PCI approved Institutions.
6. Candidates must submit the proof of **VALID GPAT SCORE** for getting fellowship from AICTE and having passed the qualifying examination, i.e. B. Pharmacy, at the time of counseling.

MEDICAL FITNESS

The selected candidates at the time of counseling will have to submit medical fitness certificate from any Govt. Medical Officer to the College of Pharmacy. The candidature of the candidate is liable to cancellation if found medically unfit. “The admission fee will be accepted only after getting positive medical fitness certificate”.

LEGAL JURISDICTION

All disputes pertaining to the conduct of examination and admission shall fall within the jurisdiction of Rohtak only.

Note: To determine the eligibility criteria, calculation of marks obtained in qualifying examination will be made as per instructions of Chief Secretary to Govt. Haryana bearing No. 22/129/ 2013-IGS-III dated 16.07.2014 (Annexure-I).

Hostel Fee:

1. Rs. 7500 /- per annum+ Rs. 2000/- Hostel security (refundable).
2. Normal electricity charges are Rs. 9000/- p.a..
3. Extra charges will have to be paid for extra electrical appliances.
4. Mess charges as applicable.

Note: Hostel accommodation will be provided subject to the availability.

REFUND OF FEE

Students withdrawing admission before 15th of August shall be refunded fee after deducting Rs 1000/- as processing fee. Students withdrawing admission on/or after 15th of August shall not be refunded any fee except security, as no seats can be filled after this date as per directive of honorable Supreme Court.

CHAPTER-VI

METHOD OF SELECTION & ADMISSION

Counseling

1. The Counseling for admission to M. Pharm. in Pharmaceutics – 2 Years' course will be held in Committee Room, Director's office, PGIMS, Rohtak and merit list of candidates will be notified on University website.
2. The candidates will be required to appear in person before the Counseling Board. No relaxation will be given to candidates who are unable to appear before the Counseling Board on the dates notified.

Results

Intimation regarding seat allotment can be seen on websites of Pt. B.D. Sharma University of Health Sciences, Rohtak www.uhsr.ac.in, pgimsrohtak.nic.in and Notice Board of College of Pharmacy, PGIMS, Pt. B. D. Sharma University of Health Sciences, Rohtak. No separate information will be sent.

Method of Admission

- (a) The provisional admission shall be made strictly in order of merit of valid GPAT score, if the seat(s) remain vacant, the vacant seat(s) shall be offered to Non-GPAT candidate(s) strictly in order of merit based on marks obtained in theory subjects of B. Pharmacy Course obtained from only AICTE/PCI approved Institutions subject to the medical fitness. Rest of the conditions shall remain as they are.
- (b) On the failure of the selected candidates to report for admission within stipulated period the vacancies caused would be filled from waiting list prepared at the time of counseling itself.

Joining

Selected candidates must join the course on the date(s) intimated to them at the time of counseling. The admission of selected candidates who fail to join by the stipulated date shall automatically stand cancelled and no correspondence in this regard shall be entertained. The college takes no responsibility of intimating for cancellation of seat.

CHAPTER-VII

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

Application for admission to M. Pharm. course, duly complete in all respects must be accompanied by the following:-

- (a) Four copies of the recent photograph (Passport size) self-attested.
- (b) Self attested copy of Matriculation /Secondary School Certificate (or its equivalent) showing the date of birth of the candidate.
- (c) Self attested copy of Certificates pertaining to the following:
 - I. Marks sheet of B. Pharm. (all years) or Provisional Pass Certificate of B. Pharm. final year, where mark sheet of final year has not been issued.
 - II. Certificate of good conduct /character from the Principal/HOD of the institution last attended.
 - III. Valid GPAT score card
 - IV. AICTE approval letter of the institution for all 4 years of B. Pharmacy.

NOTE

1. Certificates issued in the proforma prescribed by the competent authority will only be accepted.
2. **Prospectus can be downloaded from university websites www.uhsr.ac.in/ www.pgimsrohtak.nic.in**
3. The Application Form complete in all respects along with a Demand Draft of Rs. 2400 /- (Rs. 600/- for SC/BC candidates of Haryana only) in favor of **Controller of Finance, Pt. B.D. Sharma University of Health Sciences, Rohtak** (Code 4735), must reach the office of **THE PRINCIPAL, COLLEGE OF PHARMACY, PT. B.D. SHARMA UNIVERSITY OF HEALTH SCIENCES, ROHTAK** on or before 10 July, 2017 or the last date as notified on the University website.
4. The authorities do not take any responsibility for delay of form or correspondence pertaining thereto in postal transit.
5. All the particulars in the application form must be written carefully and legibly. Applications which are incomplete in required particulars or enclosures will not be considered.
6. The cost of application form will not be refunded in any case.
7. All the selected candidates shall be required to deposit original certificates. "These will be returned after completion of the Course. However, if a candidate withdraws his or her admission then original certificates/documents will be returned immediately".
8. If a candidate is admitted on the information submitted by him/her but at any subsequent stage, it is discovered that any portion of his/her information is incorrect or false, he/she

- shall be removed from the College and fee and other dues paid upto date of such removal shall be forfeited. The Competent Authority may take any further action against the student and his/her guardian as is deemed necessary.
9. The Counseling Board shall have the power to call for any document(s) from the candidate(s) in support of his/her claim and reject any certificate not considered valid. The decision of the Counseling Board in this regard shall be final.
 10. All admissions to the M. Pharm. course are provisional i.e. subject to their registration with, Pt. B.D. Sharma University of Health Sciences, Rohtak as the case may be after completing necessary requirements as per rules/ordinances.
 11. The candidate will deposit the prescribed fee within the stipulated period.
 12. In case of ambiguity in the rules, interpretation of the same by the Vice-Chancellor shall be final.
 13. Application forms received after due date and time due to any reason including postal delay will be rejected without any intimation to the candidates.
 14. The selection for admission will be cancelled if the selected candidate does not join the College on the stipulated date notified by the Counseling Board.
 15. If any candidate or his/her parents or guardian are found to have submitted any false affidavit/ certificate, not only the candidate's admission will be cancelled but the person signing the affidavit will also be liable to be prosecuted in accordance with law. Additional instructions to those given in the Prospectus can be imposed from time to time by the competent authority of the University.
 16. The rules given herein are only provisional. These may be changed or modified by the Competent Authority without prior notice. Candidates cannot make any claim on the information given in the prospectus.
 17. Mobile phones are not allowed in College premises, classes, laboratories & community area of institution.
 18. The name(s) of the student(s) who remain(s) absent from classes without reasonable cause for more than 7 days at a stretch will be struck off from the college rolls.

BAN ON RAGGING IN COLLEGE

Instructions for Curbing Ragging -

Ragging in educational institutions is banned and any one indulging in ragging is likely to be punished appropriately for which punishment may include expulsion from the institution, suspension from the institution or classes for a limited period or fine with a public apology. The punishment may also take shape of (i) withholding scholarships or other benefits (ii) debarring from representation in events (iii) withholding results (iv) suspension or expulsion from hostel or mess, and the like. If the Individuals committing or abetting ragging are not/cannot be identified, collective punishment can be awarded to act as a deterrent,

The Following will be termed as the Act of Ragging

Any disorderly conduct whether by words or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing/ treating or handling with rudeness any other student, indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities which cause or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in fresher or junior students or asking the students to do any act or perform something which such students will not do in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student.

NOTE:

Besides above, the candidates would also observe the following instructions:

- (i) It must be noted by the candidates/parents/guardian etc. that ragging is banned in the institutions and in case anyone indulging in ragging is liable to be punished appropriately including expulsion from the institution and/or imprisonment upto 3 years, and/or fine up to Rs. 25,000/-.
- (ii) The concerned Institution will have the right that to prevent/prohibition of ragging under Act Ordinance and if any, candidate admitted to the course found indulging in ragging will be cognizable offence and really means business and the Institute will not hesitate to take stern action against the offenders.
- (iii) A candidate admitted to the course in an Institution shall submit an undertaking duly signed by him/her and countersigned by his/her parents/guardian at the time of admission to the effect that he/she is fully aware of the law regarding ragging as well as the punishment and that if she/ he found guilty on this account is liable to be punished appropriately. Similar undertaking shall also be furnished by the parents/guardian that they are fully aware and noted the law in this regard and agrees to abide by the punishment meted out to his/her ward in case their ward, if admitted to the course is found guilty or ragging.

(iv) Undertaking of similar nature as given under Sr. No.III & above shall be obtained from the admitted candidates in the application form for admission to the Hostel as well.

(v) Ragging is banned by law as per order of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India dated 16.05.2007 which is reproduced below:

“If any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the authority, the concerned students shall be given liberty to explain and if his explanation is not found satisfactory, the authority would expel her/ him from the institute”

(vi) Every student for the purpose of his/her admission shall furnish Character Certificate from the institutions where he/she has passed his qualifying examination, which would mention the status of his/her behavioral pattern specially in terms as to whether he/she has displayed persistent violent or aggressive behavior or any desire to harm others.

Subject: Regarding prescribing minimum eligibility qualification for the various courses.

Sir/ Madam

I am directed to invite your kind attention towards Government instructions No. 3870-WGI-ASOIII-64/20069 dated 6th/ 9th October, 1964 whereby the candidate of Scheduled castes and Scheduled tribes provided 5% reduction in marks in the minimum eligibility qualification for admission in various courses.

It has come to the notice of the Government that at present where a General category student is required to have 50% marks in a prescribed qualification for admission in any course, as per the above instructions a reserve category candidate category is required to have 45% marks giving him 5% reduction in minimum qualification. Vide judgment of Hon'ble Supreme Court in Civil Appeal No. 7084/2011, it has been observed that practice is wrong and the relaxation of 5% should be reduced from the minimum required marks on a general category candidate For e.g.:-

In a course, a general candidate required to have 50% marks, than as per Government instruction by giving 5% relaxation the minimum eligibility marks for a reserved caste candidate should be calculated as under:-

Out of 100 marks needs to be ≤ 5

Out of 1 mark needs to be $\leq 5/100$

Out of 50 marks needs to be $\leq 5/100 \times 50 + 2.50$

This way less marks where general category candidates are required to have 50% in a prescribed qualification the total required marks for a reserved candidate will be $50 - 2.50 = 47.50$ and not 45

All the concerned are requested to implement the instructions as per the above procedure in compliance of the judgment of Hon'ble Supreme Court passed in CWP 7084/2011.
